# Getting to know you

Dianne and I were brought up in loving Christian families, and I made a personal commitment as a teenager through the influence of school friends.

We came to St Chad's in February 1976 with our two young children and were bowled over by the warm welcome we received. We were very impressed with the lively teaching of the Vicar and Lay-readers, and the participation of so many church members in the life of the church. We wondered how we would contribute ourselves!

I had come to work as a Principal Officer responsible for the social work teams in Macclesfield District Social Services, but child protection increasingly occupied my time. After 10 very happy years I was appointed County Child Protection Coordinator and helped implement the 1989 Children Act.

I became the St Chad's Safeguarding Officer and worked with the local Methodist District child protection team. I retired in 1996 and joined a similar group in the Chester Diocese. Bishop Peter

appointed me as his Child Protection Representative in 1999, which was a professionally challenging privilege.

Vicar Peter Isherwood had encouraged me to start the Singing and Music Groups to introduce into our worship some of the new Christian hymns and songs that were being written. I give thanks for the many musicians who have developed and enhanced our worship over the years.

I served on the PCC for many years, during which the new 'lounge complex' was built, the front of church re-organised, and we commemorated the centenary of the present church in 1999 with a successful exhibition and history booklet.

Over the past 40 years my faith and professional life have been closely linked. St Chad's fellowship has sustained and supported me and my family. I thank the Lord for the love and blessings we have received here. However Peter Isherwood often said "If you find a perfect church don't join as you would spoil it"!

There remains much to be done!

# Did you know?

*Magic Voices Choir – Sue Sanders*

Magic Voices Choir Wilmslow is led by Mike Bramhall who used to teach music at Wilmslow High. He is a truly inspirational teacher, full of enthusiasm which is infectious. I always feel uplifted after a rehearsal. We meet at the Parish Hall except on the second Tuesday of the month when we rehearse at St. Chad's. You don't have to audition to join, nor do you have to be able to read music, and the type of songs we sing are usually from musicals or films.

I joined the choir 4 years ago when David went to university - empty nest syndrome had hit me rather hard. I confided in a friend from work who happened to be a member of Magic Voices and she suggested

that I tried a taster session. If I'd had to audition I would never have gone! Mike also leads choirs in Marple and Hale and we join together to perform at concerts. We also sing for local charities.

Since joining the choir I've had the confidence to join the music group at the 10:30 service and have the privilege to, as it says in Psalm 95, "sing for joy to the Lord". I believe that God's hand has guided me in all this and has blessed me with the pleasure that singing in harmony with others gives.
